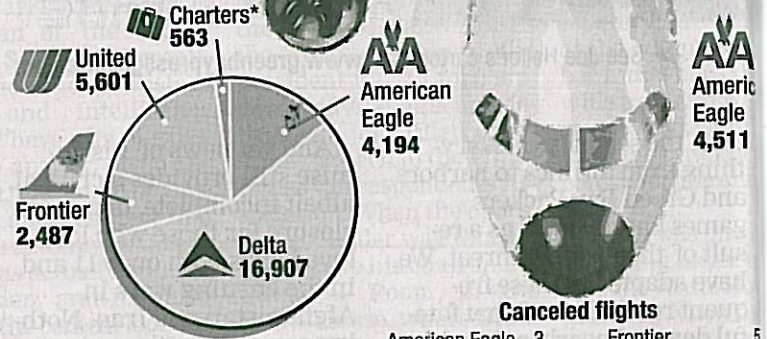

Humana posts 22% increase for first q

Company upgraded its 2011 full-year earnings forecast

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Humana Inc. said Monday its first-quarter profit rose 22 percent as the health insurer benefited from enrollment gains in its Medicare offerings and slower growth in health

expects higher earnings from its health and well-being services business.

Humana is Brown County's largest employer, with about 3,100 employees in Green Bay and De Pere.

Humana CEO Michael B. McCallister said the earnings growth reflects discipline in the company's core businesses and a growing focus on a broader array of businesses.
